#### CONSIDERABLE GAPS IN FLOOD RISK REVEALED

- New research shows nearly 27,000 more homes are at risk of flooding
- Storms and heavy rain leave much of Wyoming susceptible to flash flooding
- Spring and fall are especially dangerous seasons as places like Cheyenne see a drastic increase in heavy thunderstorms, riverine flooding, and flash flooding


